

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## Nanbu Kodai Katazome

#### Old Nanbu stencil dyeing

Nanbu Kodai Katazome, which is a stencil dyeing with Japanese traditional patterns, was started by a dyer who was invited from Kyoto to Morioka in early 17 century. The old pattern stencils and materials of Japanese indigo dye which has been inherited for generations in the family of Ono are displayed on the 2nd floor.

## Homespun

#### All handmade woven fabric

Homespun is traditional fabric made with wool dyed and spun by hand. The homespun technique developed in England was brought to lwate when sheep farming was introduced during the Meiji period, and it spread as a side job for farmers during the off-season from the Taisho to the Showa periods. At Michinoku Akanekai, panels that show the process of production from dyeing wool to weaving textiles are on display.

Fujiwara Apiary was established in 1901 and it is one of the oldest apiaries in Japan. The beekeeping field is located by the shop where the visitors can observe the bees and listen to the lecture about the bee's ecology or history of beekeeping.





Raden(Mother-of-pearl inlay) is a decorative technique that uses the iridescent inner layer of abalone shell or turban shell. The workshop uses Urushi, Japanese lacquer and shell collected in lwate. Raden accessory is rare in Japan and these are made entirely by hand from scratch. The exhibition of prize winning works and products are displayed. As our compilation of techniques,we created and released unique mechanical watch with mother-of-pearl inlay "kouga" in 2022.



## [Story of Life and Tradition: Morioka]

The history of Morioka City, which was designated as a core city in April 2008, dates back about 400 years, in the Keicho Period (1596-1615) when Nobunao, the 26th chieftain of Nanbu clan, build a castle in the hill-surrounded Kozukata area where the Kitakami River and Nakatsu river meet.

Morioka clan yielded 200,000 koku of rice and had a unique placement for buildings with a castle with double outer moat that was surrounded by merchants and craftsmen's houses which were then encircled by Samurai residences on the outer most area. The essence of the castle town still remains today as one of the "Morioka-like" features.

Under protection of Morioka clan, traditional crafting techniques have been passed down for generations and the warmth of hand made products remains in local products of Morioka with characteristics of unchanged beauty and nostalgia.
